



No visible sign of breakthrough in DU stalemate

There is no visible sign as yet to resolve the longest-ever crisis in the Dhaka University. Authorities in their latest attempt have called the rival student organisations to a negotiation table in the beginning of the next month.

The university Syndicate on Wednesday invited the striking organisation Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) for talks with Liaison Body on September 1 and the Awami League's student wing Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) on the following day.

The Syndicate once again postponed all the examinations scheduled for the next seven days on the ground of unusual atmosphere on the campus.

With the Wednesday's postponement, a total of 3,69 examinations of different departments and institutes were deferred in two spells of strikes. Fresh dates for the exams will be announced in due time, the DU authorities said.

The syndicate in its Wednesday meeting again urged the striking JCD to keep the examinations, library, and transport out of the purview of their strike considering the sufferings of the common students.
