

KU second Convocation held

KHULNA, Feb 14:—President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed has called upon the promising and scholarly graduates of Khulna University to utilise their knowledge and skills to serve the country and its people.

The President was addressing the second Convocation of Khulna University this noon on KU campus as the Chancellor of the University.
