



Students politics banned on RU campus for 10 days

RAJSHAHI, July 10:- In the wake of a tense situation Rajshahi University authorities have banned student politics on the campus for 10 days starting from today, reports UNB.

The decision came following a series of clashes among the police, ruling party-backed Chhatra League and pro-BNP Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal activists on Monday.

Proctor of the University Prof Azizul Islam issued the ban saying the authorities have taken the decision to ensure peaceful and congenial atmosphere on the campus.

According to the order all sorts of political activities including strikes, siege, gatherings and processions will be treated as offence.

The university administration asked the local police to take legal action against the outsiders and suggested the students to always carry their identity cards with them.

Vice Chancellor Prof Sayeedur Rahman Khan today held a meeting with the provosts of all the dormitories to review the law and order situation of the campus particularly in the halls.

The meeting took some important decisions like imposing restriction on illegal entry into the halls and checking of identity cards at the entrances of all the dormitories.

Meanwhile, the Proctor today had a meeting with JCD and sought cooperation from them in maintaining academic atmosphere.

However, all scheduled classes and examinations took place today as campus situation was peaceful. A huge contingent of police has been deployed on the campus.
