

Community pry teachers to go for strike from today

Bangladesh Community Primary Teachers' Association (BCPTA) for an indefinite strike across the country's community primary schools from today (Tuesday).

The teachers also threatened to stage fast-unto-death at the Central Shaheed Minar in the city if their demands are not accepted.

A Press release issued by the BCPTA said that the community teachers were forced to go for an indefinite strike as the government did not fulfil its commitment

to realise their demands, including nationalisation of their services, by July 31.

The government delegation committed to the community teachers to realise their demands by the July 31 during the meetings at the Prime Minister's Office in the city on June 21 and 26. Even after the expiry of the deadline they did not see any positive development from the government side to accept their demands, said the Press release.
