

NFTE rejects proposal

Teachers threaten to paralyse country

On the seventh day of their strike Wednesday, over 5 lakh teachers and employees of the non-government academic institutions threatened to paralyse the country, just a day after the government proposal of meeting their demand in phases.

While talking to BD News, convener of National Front of Teachers and Employees (NFTE) Kazi Faruq Ahmed said, "Teachers completely rejected the proposal...this government has only three months time in hand."

Meanwhile, teachers and employees of the non-government

schools, colleges and madrasas staged demonstrations across the country for realising their eight-point demands.

The NFTE leader said they are due to lay siege on all TNO and DC offices on July 18 and July 20 respectively along with their ongoing strike programme.

The agitating teachers later would cripple the country if their demands were not met.

Again, Bangladesh Technical College Teachers Association (BTCTA) staged demonstration and later held a rally at Muktan-gon in the city at 11am over realising their 12-point demands. The three platforms of the agitating teachers expressed solidarity with its demand.
