Scientists urged to build happy, prosperous nation

The 14th National Science and Technology Week concluded in Dhaka on Tuesday reports BSS.

Minister for Education and Cultural Affairs Prof. A.Q.M. Badruddoza Chowdhury attended the closing ceremony of the week as chief guest at the National Science Museum in Dhaka.
