

UNDP aid for science museum

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) will provide Bangladesh 25,500 US dollars as project assistance for the development of the National Museum of Science and Technology, a UNDP Press release said in Dacca on Friday reports BSS.

The project will assist the Government in promoting scientific and technological education in Bangladesh and also support the development of museum services in the country.

The project will provide the services of an architect specialist familiar with museum construction.

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struction. He will study the draft layout and advise the museum authorities on the design and drawing of the plan for a new museum building and on cost estimate.

Another consultant will be provided who will advise on the audio-visual exhibit needs of the museum. Additionally the project will provide an observation and study tour of the Director of the Museum to Calcutta, Tokyo, Seoul and Singapore to establish link with museums in the Asian region the press release said.

The project will be executed by the United Nations Educational Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) on behalf of UNDP.
