## JUTA concern over bid to acquit accused in teachers' case

The Jahangirnagar University Teacher's Association (JUTA) in a statement on Tuesday expressed concern over the bid to acquit the people from the cases filed by university authorities under anti-terrorism law.

JUTA President Prof. Khandaker Mustahidur Rahman and General Secretary Prof. Sharif Inamul Kabir in a joint statement said that the university authorities have filed a case against 21 people for their involvement in the violent incident on July 29, of which only six persons have so far been arrested.

Without nabbing other accused people the Savar thana authorities were trying to release the arrested persons on bail, they alleged.

They said one of "the miscreants" released on bail recently was creating pressure on teachers to give-up movement.

Such unruly activities may hamper the initiative of the authorities to resume the university they opined and said that the government should be responsible for such situation.
