

Plan taken up to remove illiteracy from Munshiganj

MUNSHIGANJ Oct. 25. Munshiganj Pourasava has taken up an ambitious scheme to remove illiteracy from the Pourasava area in response to the appeal made by President Ziaur Rahman. As a first step the pourasava authority has opened a literacy centre at the pourasava premises for the unlettered rickshaw pullers numbering about 1,000. This centre was recently inaugurated by the Chairman Mr Abdul Khaleque Master in the presence of the pourasava commissioners.

Opening of this centre has greatly been appreciated by the town dwellers. A good number of books has also been supplied to them. According to a source this centre will function till the rickshaw pullers get the first lesson of alphabet and can write their names. Later on, the pourasava authority will open more centres in different wards for the illiterate people within their jurisdiction.

GOVERNMENT GRANT

Director of Public Instruction has allocated a sum of Taka 25,243 for Narayanganj High School during the current financial year. This amount will be made available in the form of salary for the teachers and other staff for four months only beginning from June to September under certain conditions.

WORKERS' RALLY
