Govt has no plan to cancel objective-type question

The government on Sunday made it clear that it has no plan to cancel objective-type question papers for SSC examinations, reports UNB.

A press note issued on Sunday said the system for objective-type question was introduced after extensive review and study by experts and educationists.

"The objective-type questions in examination will certainly remain unchanged", the press note said underlining that the system is being introduced in greater interest of the country as well as to improve the standard SSC examination.

The government has, however, brought about some changes in the marking system to make it more effective and to maintain the standard of the examinations.

The press note however assured that the objective questions would be

set from the approved syllabus.

According to changes with regard to marking, examinees will have to obtain a minimum of 12 marks each in subjects with objective, descriptive and practical sections.

In papers having objective and descriptive type questions and bearing 50 marks each, the examinees must secure a minimum of 15 marks separately.
