

1400 SSC examinees, 15 invigilators expelled

More than 1,400 candidates and 15 invigilators were expelled on the 4th of SSC Examination under the four education boards for adopting unfair means, officials said, reports UNB.

In last three examinations—Bangla first and second papers, and English first paper—some 2,500 examinees and 35 invigilators were expelled from different centres of the country.

The Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examinations of 1992 of Dhaka, Rajshahi, Comilla and Jessore Boards began April 19 under strict measures against unfair means.

A total of 679,010 candidates are appearing in the examinations this year from 616 centres. Of them, 88 examinees are sitting for the exam at 5 centres abroad under Dhaka Board.

According to reports reaching in Dhaka some 250 examinees were expelled in Dhaka Board during the English 2nd paper examination today. The total number of examinees in Dhaka Board is 219,582.

Some 603 examinees and 7 invigilators were expelled from 14 out of 16 districts of Rajshahi Board. The expelled invigilators were one each in Natore, Naogaon and Dinajpur, two each in Pabna and Gaibandha. One guard was also expelled at Gaibandha.

Under the Rajshahi Board, 154,318 students are appearing in the SSC Examination.

In Comilla Board, over 381 SSC

examinees and 8 invigilators were expelled on Saturday. Six invigilators were expelled from a Barura centre, and two from two centres in Miresarai and Moulavibazar. A total of 167,416 students are sitting for the examinations".

Control office sources said about 167 candidates were expelled in Jessore Board. The total number of examinees in the board is 137,694.

No major untoward incident took place during the English 2nd paper examination on Saturday. Two fake SSC examinees were arrested and another two fled when examination fraud was detected at Rajbari Government High School centre.
