

## 981 expelled on second day of HSC exam

More than 981 candidates were expelled for adopting unfair means on the second day of HSC examination which began on Thursday under the country's four education boards, official sources said.

The Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examination 1993 of Dhaka, Rajshahi, Jessore and Comilla boards began on Thursday morning. A total of 339,524 candidates including 106,968 female were appearing in the examination.

According to reports, some 302 examinees were expelled in Dhaka Board during the Bangla 1st paper examination. The highest number of 115 examinees were expelled from Mymensingh district.

According to the partial report from Controller offices, about 279 examinees were expelled in Rajshahi Board, 371 examinees in Comilla and the lowest 29 examinees in Jessore Board.

No untoward incidents were reported from any centres of the four education boards during the examination, sources said.

### 170 in Ctg

BSS from Chittagong reports:— One hundred and seventy candidates from 18 centres of the district were expelled for adopting unfair means in the examination on the second day of the Higher Secondary Certificate examination under Comilla Board.

District Control Room sources said, of the expelled 98 examinees were from Rangunia College, 23 from Kwaish Burirchar College, 29 from Noapara College, 11 from Sitakunda College and nine from Islamia College.

About 230 candidates from 18 centres were absent from examination, the source said.

However, the examinations were held peacefully. No untoward incident was reported but intermittent rains with stormy wind caused sufferings to the examinees and a number of centres were inundated in this region during the torrential rain according to report reaching here.
