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Hafizur Rahman dead

Mr. Hafizur Rahman, a former minister of erstwhile Pakistan died in Dhaka at his Segun Bagicha residence on Monday night after prolonged old age ailments. He was 84, reports BSS.

Mr. Rahman was a minister in the central cabinet from 1958 to 1962 and held various portfolios including the ministries of food, commerce and finance. He joined Bengal Civil Service in 1926 and after partition of India became a member of the Civil Service of Pakistan. He was also a lecturer at the University of Dhaka and was associated with a number of social welfare organisations.

Mr. Rahman left behind his widow, two sons, six daughters and a number of relatives and friends to mourn the death.

His Namaz-e-Janaza will be held today (Tuesday) at 10 a.m. at Tipu Mosque at Bailey Road. After the Janaza, his body will be taken to his village home at Keonjhar.
