Teacher short in Satkhira Govt. edn. institutions

SATKHIRA, Nov. 19.— The shortage of teachers in the Government educational institutions is hampering the education of the students of the district.

In the Satkhira P.T.I. four posts of instructors, one clerk, one agriculture instructor, one accountant and one librarian have been lying vacant since long.

In the Satkhira Govt. College, one post of Associate Professor in Bengali, two posts in English one post in Economics, three posts in Political Science, two posts in Philosophy, one post in Islamic Studies, one post in Chemistry, two posts in Mathematics, three posts in Botany, two posts in Zoology, three posts in Accounting three posts in Management, four

posts of Demonstrators, two posts of office Assistants have been lying vacant since 1980.

In the Satkhira Govt. Girls High School one post of Asstt. Head Mistress, two posts of Senior teachers including English and Mathematics, one post of Physical teacher, and one post of Office-assistant have been lying vacant since long.

In the Satkhira Govt. High School, one post of teacher, one office Assistant are lying vacant.

In the Vocational training institute four posts of teachers are lying vacant.

College not yet affiliated

TANGAIL, Nov. 19.— Moulana Abdul Hamid Khan Bhasani College established in 1986 at Elasin under Deiduar Upazila of Tangail district is yet to be affiliated by the concerned authority.

The college has a present roll strength of 546 students with 212 in XI class and 334 in XII class.

Mr. Mahmud Kamal, Vice-Principal of the college told this correspondent that inspite of fulfilling all the conditions it is not getting recognition because of an embargo imposed by the authority upon starting new private colleges in May this year. Mr. Kamal said that an officer of the BISE, Dhaka, made necessary inspection into the college and he was satisfied with the formalities. But because of embargo the college did not get affiliation. As a result the future of the teachers and the students of the college has become uncertain.

The teachers are not getting 70 per cent govt contribution in their salary. Even they are not getting 30 per cent of the college contribution towards their salary for the last seven months.
