All parties urged to help end Campus violence

Deputy Leader of the House Prof. Badruddoza Chowdhury Monday night sought the cooperation and support of all political parties to eliminate terrorism from the campus, reports BSS.

Mutual co-operation and sincerity of all parties were needed to curb this scourge effectively on the campus. He said adding all must have to take a pledge in the name of Allah to put an end to terrorism once for all.

He was winding up discussions in the Jatiya Sangsad on an adjournment motion moved by Workers Party leader Rashed Khan Menon to discuss the situation arising out of gun battle between two student organisations Sunday on the Dhaka University campus.

Prof. Badruddoza Chowdhury said in unequivocal terms that the government on its part was very much sincere to eliminate terrorism from the campus. But the Opposition must have to demonstrate the matching

response in this respect, he said and added "we want to create such a situation on the campus so that no mother has to lose her children any more because of terrorism."

He said with the establishment of parliamentary democracy in the country a great responsibility had now devolved on the Opposition to run the affairs of the state smoothly and properly. The Opposition must remember that they were no longer "domestic opposition" in the Sangsad, he added.

Prof. Badruddoza Chowdhury expressed the hope that none would create any impediment in the way of the government for curbing terrorism. He was happy to state that the Deputy Leader of the Opposition had given an assurance in this regard. "We want to see that the Opposition is sincere in its commitment," he added.

He told the House amid cheers of

the Treasury Bench members that the Home Minister would soon expose the terrorists.

The Deputy Leader of the House said terrorism would do no good to any party. In this connection, he made a passionate appeal to all parties not to patronise or harbour terrorists. Prof. Chowdhury urged the Opposition to prove its sincerity in curbing terrorism by expelling the killers of Dr. Milon.
