## DU hall provost office ransacked

A group of students Wednesday afternoon staged a demonstration, besieged the office of the Provost of Salimullah Hall of Dhaka University for more than half an hour and ransacked his office room protesting against the police presence in their hall, reports BSS.

Witnesses said some plain clothes police entered the hall having information that the suspected killers of Dr. Shamsul Alam Milon were staying there.

Taking prior permission of the hall provost, they searched some of the identified rooms of the hall, the campus sources said.

Later a group of students agitated against the Provost giving permission to the police and at a stage they damaged the provost's room and its furniture.

Immediately after the police action, Bangladesh Chhatra League (A-A) brought out procession in the hall chanting slogans against the Provost and the Vice-Chancellor.

### Call to withdraw expulsion order

Bangladesh Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) Wednesday appealed to

the President and Chancellor of the Universities to withdraw the expulsion order from its three leaders.

The appeal was made in a rally held Wednesday at the Aparajeya Bangla of the University. Organised by the JCD Central Committee, the rally was attended by a large number of JCD followers who came from different parts of the city.

The rally was addressed among others, by DUCSU G.S. Khairul Kabir Khokan, AGS Nazim Uddin Alam, Moniruzzaman Munir and Mosharref Ahmed Thakur. JCD Joint Convenor Fazlul Haq Milon was in the chair.

Recalling the contribution of the expelled leaders Kamruzzaman Ratan, Elias Ali and Abdul Malek the JCD leaders said these student leaders had played an important role during the nine-year long anti-autocratic movement and student struggle in the late November 1990.

After holding the rally, the JCD submitted a memorandum to the V.C. of the University demanding withdrawal of the expulsion order served on them in 1987.
