

Chilahati Girls' School left incomplete

NILPHAMARI, May 20:—Chilahati Girl's High School has been facing multifarious problems hampering the education of students.

The school was established in 1969 with the help of local people. There are 9 teachers in the school for about 400 students.

The Rajshahi Unnayan Board sanctioned grant for the construction of the buildings in the year 1978. The allotted money was not sufficient to construct the buildings. As a result two buildings of the school were left incomplete.

The main building was a tinshed. The school building has become unfit for holding classes. Rain water falls in the class room through leakages.

There are no library, reading room and common room.

There is no boundary wall of the school. The school has no auditorium for holding meetings and cultural functions.

The school is facing shortage of furniture including sitting arrangements for the students. There is acute shortage of space in the school. In the absence of sufficient number

of class rooms all classes are suspended during the S.S.C. test examination.

There are no hostel and no play ground in the school.

The school has not been properly electrified. There are no fans in class rooms. In the absence of fans, teachers and students are suffering during summer.

There is no science building. Laboratory room has no instruments. The science building should be built.

While contacted the headmaster of the school told me that the school has been facing a host of problems.
