Domar Govt girls school faces problems

NILPHAMARI, Nov. 4:—The Domar Government Girls High School has been facing manifold problems hampering the education of the students.

Established in 1962 the school was nationalised in 1986 but lacks education facilities. There were 9 teachers in the school for about 300 students. Assistant Head Mistress post have been lying vacant for a long time.

Due to absence of staff quarters the teachers are living in private houses. Acute shortage of class rooms hampers education in the school.

The main building was declared unfit for use 5 years ago but no steps have been taken for renovation. At the risk of life, classes are holding in the premises.

There are no library and reading room. The school has no auditorium for holding meetings and cultural functions.

The school is facing shortage of furniture including sitting arrangements for the students.

The school building has not been properly electrified. There are no fans in the class rooms. The absence of fans caused suffering to the teachers and students during the summer.

Extra-curriculum activities are almost absent in the school. There are no librarian, typist, clerk and peon in the school. While contacted the Head Mistress of the school told this correspondent that the school has been facing a lot of problems.
