11-pt resolution

DUCSU convention for restoration of campus peace

The students' convention organised by Dhaka University Central Students Union (DUCSU) adopted an 11-point resolution including implementation of a 10-point charter of demands of a students community, reports BSS.

The convention on Sunday ended with a call for restoration of congenial atmosphere and maintaining peace and harmony in the campuses and consolidating democracy by uprooting terrorism, anarchy and conspiracy.

Prime Minister Begum Zia inaugurated the convention which was attended by a large number of elected office bearers of central students union from all over the country. It was attended also by Ministers, State Ministers, MP's, BNP

leaders, leaders and workers of JCD. Among those who addressed the convention, were Foreign Minister A.S.M. Mostafizur Rahman, Education Minister Barrister Jamir Uddin Sircar, Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University Prof. Moniruzzaman Miah, Barrister Moinul Hossein, journalist Reazuddin Ahmed and over fifty delegates including DUCSU leaders Khairul Kabir Khokan and Nazim Uddin Alam.

In the resolution, the convention urged the government to arrest and the terrorists and trouble mongers from country's educational institutions and bring back the desired academic atmosphere. To take necessary steps for solving residential problems in different educational institutions and creating job opportunities for unemployed.

The convention called for creating temporary employment opportunities for students by engaging them in various national activities including free plantation, mass education, and canal digging programmes. The convention demanded arrest and trial of all accomplices of the post autocratic regime and called upon the students to form an all-party anti-violence committee to resist acts of terrorism.

In the resolution, the convention demanded withdrawal of false cases filed against the democratic workers by the autocracy during last nine years.

The convention thanked the Prime Minister and her government to the give highest allotment in education sector, to open the Khulna and Sylhet universities, and its decision to set up seven medical colleges and an Open University. It also thanked the government jobs and for giving the opportunity to girls to have free education in the rural areas and to start mass education and compulsory primary education programme.

The convention decided it will observe May 31 to June 6 as "anti violence and anarchy week", through holding countrywide processions and rallies. It will also hold a rally on June 6 in Dhaka as a part of central programme.
