### 16 student bodies express concern

Sixteen students organisations including the DUCSU in a joint statement on Monday night expressed their concern and resentment at the efforts to disturb communal harmony in the country by a vested interest group following demolition of the historic Babri Mosque in India, says BSS.

The signatories to the statement strongly condemned the demolition of the 16th century mosque by the Hindu fundamentalists saying that the incident had shattered the secular policy of India as its government miserably failed to protect the Babri Mosque.

They said the Babri Mosque incident served a blow to the regional cooperation spirit of south Asian nations and was a part of international conspiracy to create communal frenzy in the area.

They also expressed concern and resentment at the attack on the houses, shops, religious institutions of the minority community and incidents of arson on offices of the political parties. They also called upon the students community to form "students brigades" in each area of the country to face the conspiracy to create communal unrest and urged all to face the situation unitedly.
