Students' call to resist communal forces

Several thousand students of Dhaka University on Wednesday brought out a procession in the city to create public opinion for peace and communal harmony in the country following the situation arising out of the demolition of Babri Mosque in India.

The procession under the banner of All-Party Students Organisations except Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) and Islami Chhatra Shibir started from the campus and paraded main streets in the city. The processionists dispersed at Dhakeswari temple.

On the eve of the procession, a brief rally was held at the foot of Aparajyo Bangla which was addressed among others by Awami League backed Bangladesh Chhatra League President Mainuddin Hasan Chowdhury, DU unit General Secretary Pankaj Nath, Abdullah Al Kafi Ratan of Chhatra Union, and

Obaidul Haq Chunnu of Chhatra League (JSD-Inu).

The speakers at the rally blamed the Indian Government for what they said its failure to protect Babri Mosque and requested all to exercise outmost restraint and maintain peace and communal harmony at all cost in the country.

It is the duty of all peace-loving people in the country to unitedly resist provocation by interested quarters to disrupt peaceful coexistence of Muslims with other minority groups including Hindu, they said.

They blamed Jamaat, Shibir, Freedom Party and Jubo Command for destroying temples and looting houses of Hindus in the country following the demolition of Babri Mosque.

The leaders urged the conscious students to remain alert so that the communal forces can be resisted from disrupting communal harmony.
