Students call to maintain peace, harmony

Leaders of the different student organisations made a fervent call to all sections of the people to maintain peace and communal harmony for the sake of national integrity.

The student leaders also gave a clarion call to the students community to remain alert against any bid to foil communal harmony and peace with the issue of demolition of the Babri Mosque.

The student organisations brought out processions and held rallies separately on Dhaka University campus and in the city demanding adequate security measures of the country's Hindu community.

Bangladesh Chhatria League (M-I) at a rally called upon the people to maintain peace upholding the glorious image of the country's communal harmony. They also strongly condemned the demolition of Babri Mosque by the Hindu fundamentalist and said that with the issue of Babri Mosque a group of people were trying to create trouble to achieve their evil design.

The rally, held at TSC of Dhaka University, was addressed among others by Dhaka University Unit President K.H.M. Lizu and General Secretary Pankaj Nath.

They criticised the Indian government for what they said its failure to protect Babri Mosque and said that the demolition of the mosque had unmasked the naked communal character of Bharatiya Janata Party (B.J.P.).

They blamed the Jamaat-Shibir Freedom Party and Jubo Command for its attempt to foil communal harmony with the issue of Babri Mosque and urged the people to remain alert against such bid.

Bangladesh Chhatria Union (BCU), the student wing of CPB, brought out a procession and held a rally on the campus urging the people to maintain peace and communal harmony in the country.

The rally, held at the foot of Aparajeo Bangla, was addressed among others by BCU President Nasir-Ud-Doza, General Secretary Ruhin Hossain Prince and Abullah Al Kafi Ratan.

They said that the Hindus in Bangladesh were not responsible for the demolition of the Babri Mosque at Ayodhya in India and urged the people to take efforts to preserve the property of Hindu community.

Besides, Chhatria League (M-L), Chhatria League (JSD-Inu), Chhatria Kendra, Mukti Joddha Chhatri Command and Bangladesh Chhatri Dal brought out separate processions and held rallies on the campus.

Meanwhile, Jagannath Hall Chhatri Sangsad leaders in a press conference on Monday evening strongly condemned the demolition of Babri Mosque and criticised the Indian government for its failure to save the mosque.

They also expressed concern over the attempt to create trouble by a section of people with the Babri Mosque issue in the country and urged the people to maintain peace and harmony for the common interest of the people.

The Press conference was addressed among others by Sangsad Vice-President Subash Singh Roy, General Secretary Sujit Kumar Roy Nandi, Assistant Sports Secretary Tapash Kumar Saha, BCL central leaders Nirmal Guha and Swapon Basu.

They said that at least one hundred family took shelter in the hall premises from different areas of the city.
