BCL siege at CU gate withdrawn for 3 days

CHITTAGONG, May 8:—Bangladesh Chhatra League in Chittagong University has put off its blockade programme for three days in the greater interest of admission test for the new students.

This decision was taken at a meeting held between the university authority and pro-AL Chhatra League leader at the Vice Chancellor's campus residence on Wednesday afternoon. The Vice Chancellor Professor Abdul Mannan, Chittagong Range Deputy Inspector General of Police Abdur Rahim Khan and Chittagong SP Abdur Rauf were present in the meeting.

Under that understanding, the Chhatra League agreed to withdraw blockade of university on Thursday, Saturday and next Thursday (May 15), the dates fixed for the admission test of the freshers of the Institute of Forestry, Institute of Marine Science and Kha-Unit respectively, according to the university authority.

As per that understanding arrived in the meeting, the admission test of freshers in the Institute of Forestry was held uninterrupted today. And the academic life on the campus was normal as the Chhatra League activists withdrew their siege to the entrance of campus.

Meanwhile, the government has set up one-member inquiry committee with Range DIG Abdur Rahim Khan. Besides, the 3-member inquiry committee that was set up earlier with ADC (General) CQM Mushtaque Ahmed as Chief submitted its report today. The outcome of the report could not be known.
