

HSC results of 4 boards announced

Dhaka 24.32 pc, Comilla 30.76 pc Jessore 19.35 pc, Ctg 34.49 pc

The results of Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations held this year under Dhaka, Comilla, Jessore and Chittagong Education Boards were announced on Thursday.

The results of Rajshahi Board are likely to be published tomorrow (Saturday), official sources said.

The percentage of pass is 24.32 in Dhaka Board, 30.76 in Comilla Board, 19.35 in Jessore Board and 34.49 in Chittagong Board.

A total of 99,175 students came out successful out of 3,93,959 who appeared in HSC examinations under four boards held from June to August this year.

Under Dhaka Board, 42,229 students passed out of 1,73,640 who appeared in the HSC examinations from the board in Science, Humanities and Commerce groups. Of the passed students, 11,163 obtained first division, 24,797 second division and 6,269 third division.

Mohammad Monirul Haque (Roll 123232) of Mirzapur Cadet College topped the combined merit list of Science, Agricultural Science and Home Economics group, securing 957 marks with letters in M,P,C, St.

Ali Saber M Manzoorul Abedin (Roll 305443) of Dhaka College stood first in the combined merit list of Humanities, Islamic Studies and Music group, securing 890 marks with letters in L, Psyc, G, St.

M Abdus Sobhan (Roll 529556) of Dhaka Commerce College stood first in the Commerce group, securing 822 marks with letters in Bk, St.

Moushumi Sharmin (Roll 112411) of Viqarunnisa Noon College stood first among female candidates from Science, Agricultural Science and

Home Economics group, securing 936 marks with M,P,C, St.

Easmin Saleha (Roll 320059) of Ideal School and College, Motijheel, stood first among the female candidates from Humanities, Islamic Studies and Music group, securing 859 marks with letters in L,Psyc,St.

Samia Sultana (Roll 509963) of Viqarunnisa Noon College stood first among female candidates from Commerce group, securing 820 marks with letters in Bk,St.

A total of 23,715 students came out successful under Comilla Board out of 77,105 who appeared in the examinations. Of the passed students 3,539 got first division, 16,075 second division and 4,101 third division.

M Shahed Kamal Mazumder (Roll 109234) of Comilla Cadet College topped the combined merit list in Science, Agricultural Science and Home Economics group, securing 974 marks with letters in M,P,C,St.

Kazi SM Sayem (Roll 343242) of Comilla Cadet College stood first in the combined merit list of Humanities, Islamic Studies and Music group, securing 816 marks with letters in G,St.

Mir Mosharraf Hossain (Roll 502513) of Noakhali Government College stood first in the merit list of Commerce group, securing 737 marks with letters in Bk,St.

dies and Music group, securing 792 marks with letters in L,G,He,Ag.

Rozina Akhtar (Roll 512086) of Brahmanbaria Government College stood first among female candidates from Commerce group, securing 702 marks with letter in Shnd.

Under Jessore Board, a total of 20,650 students came out successful out of 1,06,739 who appeared in the examinations. Of the successful candidates, 4,260 got first division, 13,528 second division and 2,862 third division.
