## BA, BSc, BSS results announced

The results of Degree (pass) and certificate course examinations, held under the National University in 1996, were announced on Tuesday.

The average pass percentage is 43.31.

A total of 2,13,510 students from 687 colleges of the country appeared in B.A., B.S.S., BSc, B.com, B. Music and certificate course examinations. Of the examinees, 85,513 came out successful of whom 58,755 are male and 26,758 are female.

The pass percentages of male and female are 41.58 and 47.68.

According to the results, a total of 1,28,497 candidates appeared in the examinations from B.A group, of whom 51,081 came out successful. The pass percentage of this group is 42.79.

Of the successful candidates, 163 got first division, 23,772 second division and 27,146 third division.

A total of 44,049 examinees took part in B.S.S examinations, of them 17,336 passed successfully. The percentage of pass is 42.

Of the successful candidates, seven received first division, 6,642 second division and 10,687 third division.

In BSc examinations a total of 11,598 candidates appeared, of them 5,062 came out successful. The pass percentage of this group is 44.50.

Of the successful candidates, 88

obtained first division, 3,431 second division and 1,543 third division.

A total of 25,064 candidates appeared in the examination from B.Com group. Out of these examinees, 10,655 came out successful. The pass percentage is 46.28.

Among the successful candidates, 12 got first division, 4489 second division and 6154 third division.

The total students of B. Music was 36, of them 14 passed. The pass percentage of this group is 38.89. One student got first division, 12 second division and one third division.

A total of 3,466 students appeared in certificate course examinations and 1,365 came out successful. The percentage of pass is 59.76.

Md. Sirajul Islam, a private examinee bearing roll no. P443 of Sylhet-1 centre, secured first position in B.A. examination obtaining 696 marks with distinction in Islamic Studies. Md. Nurul Alam (Roll no. P97422) and Md. Abul Hasan (roll no. P1195), both appeared in the examinations as private examinees from Bogra and Panchagar centres, stood second and third. Md. Nurul Alam got 682 marks with distinction in Islamic Studies while Md. Abul Hasan received 670 marks.

Ripon Kumar Saha of Kazi Azim Uddin College, Gazipur (roll-

Gazipur 206336) secured first position in B.Sc examination obtaining 685 marks with distinction in Botany. Khandakar Md. Rakibul Haq of Dr. Malika College, Dhaka (roll-Dhaka 208863) and Rimi Afroz of Government Tolaram Collage, Narayanganj (roll-Narayanganj 207028), stood second and third. They got 681 and 675 marks.

Rehana Akhter of Government Commerce College, Chittagong (roll-Chittagong-180361) stood first in B.Com, group securing 631 marks. Md. Giasuddin of Dhaka City College, Dhaka (roll-Dhaka-109510), obtained second position securing 629 marks with letter in accounting while Md. Tajul Islam of same college (roll-Dhaka-189640) captured third position obtaining 628 marks with letter in accounting.

In B.S.S examination, Md. Nuruddin, a private examinee (roll-Dhaka-P151343), secured first position getting 631 marks. The second position was jointly captured by Mahbub Hasan of Comilla Victoria College, Comilla (roll-Comilla 131164) and Md. Sakhawat Hossain of Nawab Faezunnesa College, Laksham, (roll-Laksham-132486) obtaining 620 marks. Md. Amir Hossain of Nawab Faezunnesa College, Laksham (roll-Laksham 132543) obtained third position bagging 610 marks.
