Examination centres stormed

Medical admission test postponed

Admission tests of MBBS for the session 1990-91 have been postponed in D.M.C. centre as a section of admission seekers stormed and ransacked the examination centres.

At least five candidates were beaten up by the unruly candidates and the answer scripts were torn by the disqualified candidates.

Only a few answer scripts were collected out of 4,749.

The trouble started first at Arts faculty building as III candidates were refused to appear at the examination by the authority, though admit cards were issued in their names.

The disqualified candidates asked the Hall Superintendent Prof. Abdus Salam to explain the cause for cancellation of the admit cards.

But he failed to answer.

The disqualified candidates then forced the admission seekers out of the rooms. They seized and tore their answer scripts.

The procession came to DMC and ransacked the gallery No.1.

The Invigilator of Badrunnessa College said the protestors entered the college and snatched most of the scripts from the examination control room.

Probe body

BSS adds:—A three-member inquiry committee has been set up to probe into the incidents which led to the abandonment of the M.B.B.S. admission tests in Dhaka on Friday, it was officially stated on Friday night.

Prof Habibur Rahman Ansari, Director of Medical Education, Training and Research has been made the chairman of the committee which was the principals of Dhaka Medical College and Sir Salimullah Medical College as the two other members.

The committee is to submit its report within three days, it was further stated.

Friday's M.B.B.S. admission test examination had to be suspended as some outsiders created troubles at some examination centres.
