Admission tests in city's Govt schools to be held Jan 8, 9, 10

Admission tests in the city's 24 government schools will be held on January 8, 9 and 10, 2001.

Directorate of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education issued an order to the government schools in this regard recently, sources said.

The 24 government schools will be classified into three groups- Ka, Kha and Ga. There will be eight schools in each group. Admission tests of eight schools that belong to Ka group, will be held on January 8, the schools in the

Kha group on January 9 and the remaining eight schools belonging to Ga group will be held on January 10.

The distribution and submission of admission forms will be held in two phases-first phase from December 9 to 18 and the second phase from January 1 to 4. The authorities have decided to distribute forms in two phases in view of the ensuing Eid vacation.

The examinees interested to get admitted in class 1 of these

schools have to sit for an admission test of 100 marks- 50 in English and 50 in Bengali.

Admission seekers in class II to class IX also have to appear in admission tests of 100 marks- 30 in Bengali, 30 in English and 40 in Mathematics.

Schools in the Ka group are: Government Laboratory High School, Mirpur Government High School, Motijheel Government Girls High School, Nawabpur Government High School, New Government Girls High School, Islamia High School, and Mohammadpur Government High School.

Schools belonging to the Kha group are: Motijheel Government Boys High School, Narinda Government High School, Dhaka Government Muslim High School, Banglabazar Government Girls High School, Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Government Boys High School, Government Science College (school section), Dhanmondi Government Girls High School and Armanitola Government High School.

Schools in the Ga group are: Dhanmondi Government Boys High School, Sher-e-Bangla Nagar Government Girls High School, Quamrunnesa Government Girls High School (Dhanmondi), Collegiate School, Quamrunnesa Government Girls High School (Tikatuli), Gonobhaban Government High School and Tejgaon Government Boys High School.

The admission process in most of the prominent non-government schools in the city began to coax the guardians and children and put them into tension and anxiety well ahead of the admission dates.

The distribution and submission of admission forms of Viquarunnisa Noon School and College have already been completed and the admission test in the school will be held in the first week of January.

Distribution of admission forms of Udayan School began on November 16 and it will continue till November 23 (Thursday), a teacher of the school told The Bangladesh Observer.

The guardians were found collecting admission forms from the Udayan School standing in a long queue for their wards. Admission tests at the Udayan School will be held on November 26 to fill up 150 seats in class I. Admission tests to other classes are likely to be held in January, the teacher added.
