A meeting to condole the death of Prof. Malik Khushro Chowdhury, a former Chairman of the Department of Economics and the former Dean of the Faculty of Social

Sciences of Jahangirnagar University, was held on Wednesday at 12-00 noon under the presidency of Prof. Zillur Rahman Siddiqui, the Vice-Chancellor of the University.

Among others who spoke are Dr. A. F. M. Kamaluddin, the Chairman of the Department of Geography, Mr. Abul Hossain Chowdhury, Registrar of the University, and Dr. Kaiser Hossain of Economics Department. One minute silence was observed as a mark of respect to the departed soul before the meeting started.

The meeting expressed deep sorrow over the sad demise of Prof. Chowdhury and sympathised to the members of the bereaved family.

Earlier on Tuesday on receiving the sad news all the classes of the University were suspended and the offices were closed after 11 a.m. The students, teachers and employees also came to Dacca Airport to receive the body of Prof. Chowdhury that was to come from Bangkok. It may be mentioned here that he died in Bangkok on Sunday last.
