

Alim, Kamil, Fajil exams results out

The results of Alim, Kamil and Fajil examinations held in May-June this year under Bangladesh Madrasah Education Board were announced on Monday, says BSS.

Adviser to the President on compulsory Primary Education Alhaj Mansur Ali Sarkar announced the results at a Press conference at the conference room of the Education Ministry at the Secretariat in Dhaka.

A total of 25,626 candidates appeared in the Alim examinations and of them 11,523 came out successful. The percentage of pass is 44.96.

Three hundred and forty-nine (349) candidates were placed in the First Division, 4,626 in the Second Division and 6,548 in the Third division. A total of 2,608 examinees were expelled from the examination halls.

In the Fajil examinations, 7,099 examinees came out successful out of a total of 15,199 candidates. The percentage of pass is 46.7 thirty seven candidates secured first Division, 2,173 Second Division and 4,889 Third Division. The number of expelled students from the examination halls was 1,646.

Nine thousand one hundred and fifty-five candidates appeared in the Kamil examinations, of them 5,508

came out successful. The percentage of pass is 60.16, a total of 104 examinees were placed in the First Division, 2,593 in the Second Division and 1,811 in the Third Division 2,593 in the Second Division and 2,811 in the Third Division. Five hundred and fifty candidates were expelled from the examination halls.

The examinations were held in 158 centres throughout the country. Adviser Mansur Ali Sarkar said, the percentage of pass reduced by 10 per cent this year in comparison to the previous year due to strong measures taken by the Government to check unfair means in the examination halls.

The results announcing ceremony was also attended by Additional Secretary in-charge of Education Ministry Jamil Chowdhury and Chairman of Madrasah Education Board M. Abdul Mannan.

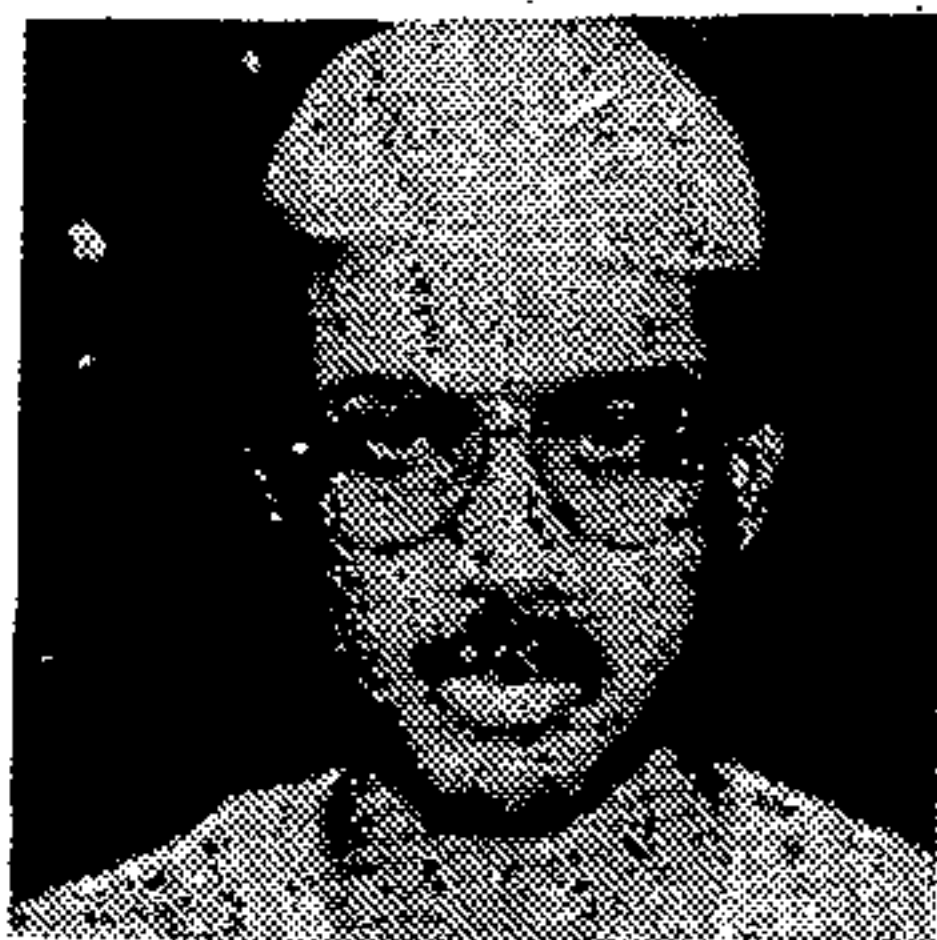


Stands first in Kamil exam
