CUCSU leaders call on Shahabuddin

A delegation of CUCSU called on Acting President Shahabuddin Ahmed in Dhaka on Wednesday and briefed him about the situation in Chittagong University campus, reports UNB.

The student leaders explained to the Acting President how the Dec. 22 clashes occurred on the campus that left two people killed and forced the authorities to close the university indefinitely.

They put forward a number of demands including one that calls for a ban on "communal politics". The students also called for recovering unauthorised arms from the campus and send three badly injured students abroad for treatment.

The student leaders said those responsible for creating violence on the campus be arrested and punished. Measures should also be taken against some teachers who, according to them, are supporting the violence mongers.

The Acting President told the students that he will consider ordering a judicial probe into the Dec. 22 incident.

dents.

However, he advised the students not to act in a way that may cause fresh trouble on the campus. He urged them to refrain from making provocative speeches and statements.
