

Education must for uplift: Biswas

President Abdur Rahman Biswas Wednesday stressed on the spread of education in the country for its balanced development, says BSS.

He said no nation can aspire to achieve prosperity without the development of human resources through modern education.

The President was talking to a 40 member delegation of the Bangladesh Federation of Teachers' Association who called on him at Bangabhaban. Chairman of the Federation Shaikh Amanullah and Secretary General Principal Quazi Faruque Ahmed led the delegation.

Terming the teachers as the conscious and enlightened citizens of the country, the President said it is the teachers who enkindle the light of education in the students for building their career in a proper way.
