

Priority to technical edn reiterated

Prime Minister Shah Azizur Rahman on Sunday reiterated the Government policy to give the country's education system a technical bias to meet the demands of national development, report BSS.

The Prime Minister was speaking as the chief guest at a reunion of old students of Nabu Kumar Institution—one of the oldest schools in the city on Sunday morning.

Presided over by Al-Haj Moulana Fazlul Karim the function was also addressed by Prof. Abdul Baten State Minister for Education. Two former students of the Institution, Air Vice Marshal Md. Sadruddin, Chief of Air Staff Dr. Jafarullah Chowdhury an eminent social worker also spoke on the occasion.

The Prime Minister said the

He said the lot of the people could not be changed and improved unless more emphasis was given on the study of science and technology. The country needed more engineers, builders, scientists and technicians for attaining national development, he said.
