Gunshots rock DU campus

Gunshots rocked at the Dhaka University campus again as two rival factions of a student organisation exchanged fire on Thursday evening from TSC and Shamsunnahar Hall area.

Witnesses said some youths reportedly activists of BCL (A-A) opened fire from the direction of TSC. Several rounds of gunshots were also heard from the direction of Shamsunnahar Hall and Jagannath Hall areas at the same time.

Panic stricken students and pedestrians ran helter skelter for safety during the incident.

Immediately after the incident BCL (A-A) leaders and activists brought out a procession from Jagannath Hall and paraded the TSC area in protest against the incident.

BCL held a brief rally at the TSC island and blamed "Government agents" for gunshots.

Pankaj Nath, a BCL leader, while addressing the rally alleged "the Government agents" were trying to disrupt the congenial atmosphere on the campus by creating violence.

He demanded punishment of those

responsible for the incident

UNB adds: Earlier, some 300 youngmen allegedly looted foods and funds from the Dhaka University Snacks (DUS) at TSC at noon.

They were reportedly supporters of pro-JSD (Inu) Chhatra League (N-S).

During the ransack, two DUS employees were also beaten by the youths, some of them well-equipped.

BUET student stabbed

DMCH Correspondent adds: Ashiqur Rahman, a third year student of Naval Architect department (old) of BUET and Indoor Games Secretary of EUCSU, was admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital with stab injury on Wednesday night.

According to a report, Ashiqur Rahman did not allow a BUET student, Khokan, to attend a charity concert without ticket at the BUET auditorium on Wednesday night. Later Khokan came with a group of outsiders and attacked Ashiqur Rahman and stabbed him the midnight on the BUET campus.

Ashiqur Rahman was immediately taken to DMCH and admitted there. His condition is stated to be critical.
