## Charges framed against six teachers of Rajshahi Varsity

RAJSHAHI, Sept 17-Six teachers of Rajshahi University were on Monday indicted for violation of the Emergency Power Rules through their alleged involvement in the recent campus violence, reports UNB.

Judge of the Speedy Tribunal Fazlul Karim Chowdhury framed the charge against the teachers, who are all in jail following the late-August turmoil in a backlash against the incidents at Dhaka University.

They are former RU vice-chancellor Prof M Saidur Rahman Khan, RU Progressive Teachers' Alliance convenor Prof M Abdus Sobhan of Applied Physics department, Prof Moloy Kumar Bhowmik of Management department and Dulal Chandra Biswas, Syed Selim Reza Newton and Abdullah Al Mamun of Mass Communication department.

Rapid Action Battalion (RAB) personnel arrested the first three on August 24 while the others surrendered in a court on Wednesday following arrest warrants.

against 13 persons, including two RU professors, for torching a DGFI vehicle during the campus violence on August 22 will be framed Tuesday.

Rajshahi Metropolitan Magistrate's Court for speedy trial Sunday issued warrants of arrest against and ordered attachment of property of the 13 persons, who are on the run.

The two teachers wanted in the case are Prof Dr Golam Sabbir Sattar Tapu and Prof Dr Chowdhury Sarwar Jahan Sajal.
