Survey on Post-primary reveals

## Per head expenditure more in Pvt than govt schools

RAJSHAHI, July 28:—The per head expenditure is more in private high schools than that in government high schools.

The students are securing more marks but standard of education is falling. To overcome the crisis proper and improved training of teachers must be provided.

More over approval of new schools must be given after screening all needed criteria properly.

These informations was presented on Thursday at a seminar on Post Primary Educational Institution Survey 2005 and Bangladesh Educational Statistics 2006 at HSTTI.

The Seminar was organised by Bangladesh Bureau of Education Information and Statistics-BANBEIS.

RU VC Prof. Altaf Hossain was chief guest in the seminar while special guest was Rajshahi Education Board Chairman Prof.

Enamul Huq and Prof. Zobdul Huq. The welcome address was given by BANBEIS System Manager Mofazzal Hossain.

In the second session the presentation was made by BANBEIS Director, Ahsan Abdullah, Statistical Officer Khan Jahan Ali and System Manager Mofazzal Hossain.

It is revealed in the seminar that post primary educational institutions are 34,013 in the country. Out of which 33,109 are private and only 904 are government.

In this criteria from Class VI to X, dropouts rate is 80.02 per cent. In case of boys it is 76.54 per cent and girls 83.29 per cent.

In the Higher Secondary sector dropouts rate is 36.52 per cent. In case of boys it is 36.81 per cent and girls 36.81 per cent. Statistics shows in classes VI to X, dropout rate of girls is more than boys. But in Higher Education drop out rate is almost same in case of girls and boys.
