Sircar urges striking teachers to join duty

Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar Tuesday urged the striking teachers of non-government schools to join their duties and cooperate with the authorities to conduct the on-going S.S.C examinations, reports BSS.

Making a statement at the Jatiya Sangsad on the situation arisen out of strike by a section of teachers of private schools, the Education Minister said 12 out of 15 point demands of the teachers of private schools had been met by the government.

He said besides recommendations of the committee comprising representatives of the teachers for amending regulation for non-government school, 1977, framing service rules and forming managing committee in line with the provisions of UNESCO and ILO were awaiting finalisation at a general meeting of the associations of the teachers.

The minister listed various development projects in the education sector of the government and said government efforts for professional development of the teachers and education sector would continue.

He hoped that the teacher com-
