

Agitation programmes may hamper CU academic calendar

CHITTAGONG, Aug 11:-The 'academic fate' of the students of CU now in grip of student bodies as they are observing agitation programmes to press home their demands.

Islami Chhatra Shibir (ICS), student wing of Jamaat-e-Islami, called an indefinite strike on CU campus in support of their 10-point demands from August 10. Their demands are included rehabilitation of legally allotted students in the halls of the university, removal of present proctor of CU, arrest of those Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activists who are involved in the killing and toll collection on the campus, recovery illegal arms and withdrawal of ban on political activities on the campus.

While talking to the Bangladesh Observer, CU ICS President Alauddin Sikdar said, we are determined to observe the strike. But, if the CU authority fulfil our demand of rehabilitation of legally allotted students in CU halls, we will reconsider our programme.

Meanwhile, BCL, student wing of Awami League, threatened to go for agitation programme within a short time if their five-point demands were not met immediately include arrest and punishment of those ICS men who are involved in the attack on four BCL men on July 27, arrest and punishment of those persons who were involved in the killing on

campus in the past, arrest of terrorists and recover of illegal arms from ICS captured halls, reform of Environmental Council (EC) with neutral persons and inclusion of student representation in that and rehabilitation of general students in the three ICS captured halls of the university.

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), student wing of BNP also submitted a six-point demands to the EC to normalise the present critical situation in CU. These demands are inscribe the name of former Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia on the buses which she presented to CU, rehabilitation of legal students in halls, form judicial committee to probe in all killings on the campus and punish those who were involved in those killing, withdrawal of ban on political activities on the campus, announcement of date of CUCSU election and repair of railway tracks for university shuttle trains. They also threatened to go for greater movement if their demands were not met immediately.

Meanwhile, Samajtantrik Chhatra Front (SCF) demanded reform of EC and include representatives from student organisation, employees organisation and officer organisations in that.

Gariotantrik Chhatra Oikya (GCO) will submit a memorandum to the Syndicate members while they will sit for a meeting on the campus to press home their three-point demands.
