

Appointment of new CU VC resented

CHITTAGONG, Feb. 16:—Se-
rious resentment has been devel-
oped among the teachers of Chit-
tagong University over the ap-
pointment of new Vice-Chancel-
lor ignoring the traditional and
democratic process of the univer-
sity.

After the just concluded senate
election 'we are in the process to
select a VC panel', said an ag-
grieved teacher belonging to pro-
AL pink panel in senate election.
Requesting anonymity he further
said by appointing a teacher as
new VC of the university who
contested the senate election from
BNP-Jamaat backed White Panel
concerned authority showed dis-
regard to normal process of ap-
pointing someone of their choice
from VC panel. In the Chittagong

University Senate election pro-
AL Pink Panel won 29 seats out of
33.

A senior teacher of the univer-
sity on condition of anonymity
said the process of registered
graduate representatives election
of the university scheduled to be
held soon might be stopped by
the new Vice-Chancellor. This has
become common fear among the
teachers as he does not belong to
the opposite group, said the
teacher.

On the other hand, a teacher of
the Marine Science Institute and
an office bearer of BNP-Jamaat
led White Panel said "if the new
Vice-Chancellor performs his
functions neutrally there is no
reason to oppose him."
