

Shibir threatens indefinite strike at CU from Aug 10

CHITTAGONG, Aug 6:— Islami Chhatra Shibir (ICS) submitted a ten-point charter of demand and Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) boycotted scheduled meeting with Environmental Council (EC) on Sunday at Chittagong University.

ICB led by its president Alauddin Sikdar submitted their ten-point demands including congenial atmosphere on CU campus. The other demands are rehabilitation of legal allotted students in the halls, removal of present CU proctor, arrest of those BCL activists who are involved in killing and toll collection on the campus, recovery of illegal arms and withdrawal of ban on political activities on campus. They threatened en-

forcement of indefinite strike from August 10 if their demands were not met.

Meanwhile BCL boycotted their scheduled meeting with EC. According to the BCL leaders, there are some controversial persons in the EC who were involved in the blue print of killing BCL activists in the past. They also demanded immediate cancellation of EC and form fresh EC with neutral persons.

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) in a meeting at CUCSU demanded immediate withdrawal of ban on political activities on the campus. They said that to hide the failure the authority imposed ban on political activities on the campus.
