## JU issue DU students form human chain

The students of Dhaka University on Saturday formed a Human Chain on the University campus to express solidarity with the demonstrating students of Jahangirnagar University.

The DU students carried out their solidarity programme under the banner of "DU students supporting the JU students' movement against terrorists and rapists".

Almost all the student organisations active on the campus except Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) took part in the formation of the Human Chain in front of the Arts Building.

Those who expressed solidarity, among others, were Nadira Sultana Nadi and Monzur-E-Khoda Torik of Bangladesh Chhatra Union; Zonaeed Saki of Bangladesh Chhatra Federation; Sajedul Haq of Shamajtantrik Chhatra Front; Monir Hossain of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal; Shahidul Islam Shabuj of Chhatra Oikya Forum; Hasan Imam of Biplobi Chhatra Moitri; Abul Hasan Rubel of Shuchana Addhayan Chakro; Mithun Chakma of Pahari Chhatra Parishad and Raisa Shapla of Nari Pragoti.

Meanwhile, the Pro Awami League student organisation Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), at a press conference on Saturday, denied any involvement of the organisation in the JU incident.

The BCL leaders said, "We don't even have any organisational activities on the JU campus". "All the organisational activities there had been postponed a year ago", they added.

They also said that BCL long ago had expelled the criminals who were involved in the recent JU incident. "We had ousted them from the organisation before the University authorities expelled them", they added.

They, however, congratulated the JU students for their success.
