

### About 726 HSC examinees expelled on 3rd day

Some 726 examinees and five invigilators were expelled on the third day of HSC, Alim, Fazil and HSC (Vocational) examinations across the country on Sunday for adopting unfair means, reports UNB.

Sourcees said highest 142 examinees and one invigilator were expelled under Rajshahi Education Board for cheating in Bengali first paper examination. The teacher was expelled in Kurigram.

According to HSC examination control room, 64 examinees were expelled under Dhaka Board, 26 under Jessore Board, 41 under Chittagong Board, 22 under Comilla Board, 28 under Barisal Board and 9 under Sylhet Board.

Officials at Madrasa Education Board said 233 examinees and four invigilators were expelled from 138 centres across the country for adopting unfair means in Sunday's examination.

Another control room set up by the Technical Education Board said 61 examinees were expelled from 200 centres across the country for cheating in their Sunday's exams.

UNB Khagrachhari correspondent said Prof Satyajit Chowdhury, a teacher of Panchhari College, was attacked by outsiders at Dighinala College centre for preventing them from supplying copies.

Outraged by the attack, 16 teachers of the centre refused to continue their duties, but later they performed their duties at the request of the higher authorities.

In Sherpur, four students, who were expelled Saturday, attacked the residence of Mozammel Haque, a teacher of Chowdhury Saburennesa Degree College, later at night.

Meanwhile, police arrested the four students — Lutfar Rahman, Jewel, Sadekuzzaman and Shakawat Hossain.
