

Literacy Drive

Education is the life-line of a country's development. This has been a proven fact ever since the dawn of human civilization. Accordingly our national development strategy also aims at freeing the land from the curse of illiteracy. And it is noteworthy that the literacy campaign initiated by the late President Ziaur Rahman is gaining momentum throughout the country everyday. Even those for whom literacy campaign has been launched should be given such education and training after they receive elementary education.

What is however needed is to widen scope of vocational education and training to encompass maximum number of people. And this education and training must make its recipients aware of their potential qualities and responsibilities towards themselves and society as well as help them develop their capabilities. Their efficiency will thus be promoted and their potentials utilized for greater interest of the nation.
