### Teachers call hartal tomorrow

The striking teachers of non-government schools and colleges, now holding sit-in demonstration in front of the National Press Club for the last two days, gave a call for hartal in the Dhaka City from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Tuesday (tomorrow) to realise their four-point demand.

The striking teachers will bringout procession today (Monday) at 3 p.m. and march towards Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban to handover a memorandum to the Speaker of Jatiya Sangsad.

The leaders of the Central Liaison Committee of the Teachers' Associations in an emergency meeting on Sunday adopted action programmes to realise their four-point demand.
