

BFTA call for new education policy

Leaders of Bangladesh Federation of Teachers' Association (BFTA) at a press conference at Jatiya Press Club on Friday called upon the government of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to formulate a New National Education Policy through national consensus in the light of the recommendations of Quadrat-e-Khunda Commission and all the relevant decisions taken with regard to education during the regimes of Bangabandhu, Zia, Ershad and Khaleda.

Addressing the press conference the Secretary General of the Federation principal Quazi Faruque Ahmed presented a 14-point recommendations in this connection which included mitigation of the text book crisis faced by the students and guaranteeing better academic facilities for them.

BFTA Secretary General called upon the government to enhance the existing govt contribution from 80 PC to 100 PC to the basic pay of the Non-govt. teachers and implement the court verdict regarding the services of the nationalised colleges.

He also urged the government to create posts of professors and associate professors in non-government colleges in the country.

BFTA leaders deeply appreciated Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina for formation of a national consensus government.
