

## Tension grips Khilgaon

# School boy killed by speeding jeep

A tense situation prevailed in Khilgaon area, adjoining the southern side of the Ansar Headquarters and the Government High School, on Tuesday following the death of a minor boy, Badsha (8), who was earlier critically injured on being dashed by a speeding jeep belonging to the Ansar force.

The accident took place at about 1 p.m. on the day when the boy, son of Mr. Fazlul Huq, a teacher of Khilgaon Govt. School was coming back to his house after attending classes in a local tutorial home. The injured boy was allegedly being removed by the Ansar force from the place of accident and the local people got very angry at this. The boy was taken to PG Hospital in a critical condition.

There were several rounds of stone-pelting between the two sides—the local people and the Ansar force in the adjoining Ansar headquarters. At least four persons received injuries in the scuffle which continued for about one hour. The automobile was badly damaged.

The police came to the spot at about 2.15 p.m. and brought the situation under control.

When contacted at 10.30 p.m. Monday night the Motijheel police said that one platoon of police was sent to the spot. The body of the boy was handed over to the parents, the police said.

At about 11 p.m. on Tuesday night there were announcement over mike in the area that a procession will be brought out and a condolence meeting will be held today (Wednesday) in front to the Ansar headquarters.

### Minor boy killed

A minor boy was crushed under the wheels of a speeding truck on Dhaka-Narayanganj road near

Shyampur bazar on Tuesday.

The accident took place at 5.30 p.m. and the deceased could not be identified immediately.

### Seven injured

Seven persons were injured in separate incidents in the city on Tuesday. Of the injured three were released after first aid while four others were admitted to DMCH.

Five persons were injured when a wall collapsed near northern gate of P.G. Hospital of the injured Khaleque and Kamal were brought to DMCH for admission.

Amanullah (40) was brought to DMCH in a critical condition from Kaunia, Demra on Tuesday. He was injured when a speedy bus hit him on Dhaka-Demra Road. Shirin (5) was admitted to DMCH with injuries following road accident near Nilkhet.

## BUET fails to reduce session gap

The classes of First Year Engineering and Architecture courses of session 1986-87 of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) will not begin in September as expected.
