

## DU car damaged during BCL strike

The student strike enforced by Awami League-backed Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) in the Dhaka University passed off second day on Thursday with minor violence.

BCL called the strike in protest against the Tuesday's stormy attack on a BCL rally that left at least 25 leaders and activists injured, including its President Bahadur Bepari and General Secretary Ajay Kar Khokon.

Although no classes were held the university office remained open. Earlier on Tuesday, the authorities suspended all examinations scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday. The viva-voce of the admission seekers in the Business studies was held as per the schedule.

BCL workers brought out a procession and held a protest rally in front of the DUCSU Building demanding expulsion of the JCD men involved in the attack in the university as well as their arrest and exemplary punishment.

The BCL leaders at the rally threatened to launch a nonstop strike on the campus if the demands were not met.

Some BCL activists later in the noon, attacked a university transport at TSC area. Witnesses said some BCL activists threw brick-bats on the teacher carrier.

The university proctor said the authorities would file a case against the attackers.

BCL called the two-day student strike in the Dhaka University from Wednesday and Thursday. They also called a daylong strike in all educational institutions across the country on Thursday.
