

Poor performance in last public exam None passes from one school, 17 mardashas in Netrakona

NETRAKONA, May 28:—The Education Ministry has called for explanation from 18 schools and mardashas of ten upazilas of Netrakona district about their poor performance as none has passed from these educational institutions in the last public examinations.

The Bangladesh Education Information and Statistics Bureau sources said that none has passed in the public examination

in the last year from one school and 17 mardashas of Netrakona district. The Education Ministry has called for explanation from the heads of these educational institutions about their poor performance.

There are 155 high schools, 52 junior highschools and 77 mardashas in ten upazilas of the district.

According to sources, none passed in the public examination (SSC, HSC, Degree Vocational, Business Management, Dakil, Alim, Fazil and Kamil) from 1394 educational institutions of the country in the year 2002. There are 189 schools, 128 colleges, 1077 mardashas, 11 vocational schools and 13 Business Management colleges. Siddique Morshed when contacted a confident source told this correspondent that Education Ministry would stop monthly pay order (M.P.O.) if these educational institutions failed to pull satisfactory result in the future public examinations.
