

APSU, Shibir call hartal in Ctg today

CHITTAGONG, July-14: The crisis over Chittagong University again mounted with two rival groups of students throwing open challenge to each other.

The issues that crippled Chittagong University campus now remain seemingly sprouted up and finally pervaded the Chittagong City. This is evident in the call of dawn-to-dusk hartal on Monday both by the All-party Students Unity and Shibir's front organisation Sangrami Chhatra Oikkya. Both the warring sides appear serious to show each others political strength through the successful observance of hartal in the city.

The All Party Students Unity (APSU) today held a rally at Dr. Milan Square near New Market to make tomorrow's hartal a success. The rally presided over by student leader Mosaddek Ali Majumdar was addressed among others, by CUCSU Vice President Mohammad Nazimuddin, Manjurul Alam Manju, Sankar Birar, Nath and Fakrul Islam.

The speakers sounded stern note of warning for any move to dislodge the Vice Chancellor from his post. The speakers gave ultimatum demanding the cancellation of one-man Judicial Commission report. They also demanded of the government for arrest of 63 Shibir activists on whom the Chittagong University served show cause notices.

The APSU through that rally warned that an all out movement against the government would be

launched all over the country if their demands were not met.

After the rally, the APSU brought out a procession that paraded main thoroughfares of the port city.

The Sangrami Chhatra Oikkya held rallies and demonstrations at different places to make the tomorrow's day-long hartal a success. The speakers at these rallies reiterated their demand for immediate implementation of Judicial Commission report and outright removal of Chittagong University Vice Chancellor Prof. Alamgir Mohamamd Sirajuddin. They also alleged that the University authorities made an covert move for infiltration of armed person into the campus before the opening of University next Tuesday.
