Islamic Varsity Registrar office ransacked

KUSHTIA, Oct 12: Islami Chhatra Shibir and JSD backed Chhatra League activists of Islamic University, in Kushtia in collaboration with the outsiders ransacked the office of the Registrar of the University this morning (Tuesday).

They also damaged the office of the Chairman of the Chemistry Department and the Head of the BNCC of the University, another office of the administrative building including the office of the VC.

Witnesses said that the Shibir activists brought out procession on the campus chanting slogans condemning the university authorities for nepotism about the recent appointment in various administrative and other posts of the University. They broke open the collapsible gate of the administrative building and attacked the office of the Deputy Registrar.

(Administration) Moslemuddin who is now holding the current charge of the Registrar. The room was locked from inside and Moslemuddin along with some other colleagues was present in the office.

The demonstrators belonging to Islami Chhatra Shibir and JSD backed Chhatra League damaged the room and the windowpanes as well as furniture of the room.

Moslemuddin and his colleagues were unhurt. They also ransacked the BNCC office of Harunur Rashid Khan, Assistant Professor of the Department of English and incharge of the BNCC. Later, they damaged the office of Chairman of the Chemistry Department Prof Alauddin.

Meanwhile, a contingent of police with a magistrate rushed to the University campus and by then the demonstrators disappeared.

When contacted, the Registrar of the University Dr Moselumuddin told this correspondent that it was the act of a vested group of job seekers belonging to Shibir and JSD. Most of them were outsiders. According to him, property worth over Tk six lakh were damaged. The VC of the University Prof M Kaisuddin who was at his office. He was holding meetings with the officers and the senior teachers of the University. But the outcome of the meetings is not known till filing this report and none has been arrested so far.
