Probe body on BAU clash formed

MYMENSINGH, Dec. 18:—
Bangladesh Agricultural University
Vice-Chancellor Dr. Shah Moham-
mad Faruque today (Monday) urged
all to record their statement with the
enquiry committee formed to probe
Saturday's violence on the campus
that left three students killed, reports
UNB.

The enquiry committees formed
after many incidents in the past could
not function with success due to lack
of witnesses, he said explaining the
campus situation to the university
officials at the Zainul Abedin au-
ditorium.

The VC also sought cooperation
from students, guardians, officials,
teachers and political leaders to en-
sure a congenial academic atmos-
phere in the university.

He said that there might be politic-
al differences among the students but
all should remember that the campus
is 'not a battle-field.

Arms recovered

Another report adds: The security
branch of the Bangladesh Agricultu-
ral University today (Monday) reco-
vered a single barrel gun from out-
side the boundary wall of Shajalal
Hall.

The gun, recovered after the
Saturday's clash on the campus that
left three students killed and 50
injured, was handed over to the local
police, university sources said.

The university has been closed till
December 31 following the Satur-
day's incident.

Meanwhile, the university officials
said, the work for first year admis-
sion test is going on smoothly and all
foreign students of the university are
well.
